## CEO Speaks to WJCT's First Coast Connect about Reality Check First Coast

On November 25, 2009, Council CEO Brian Teeple spoke with WJCT's Melissa Ross about Reality Check First Coast on the daily radio call-in show, First Coast Connect. He provided an overview of the visioning exercise and answered questions from callers. Callers' questions covered topics including technological alternatives for commuting, connecting greenways, bike paths and sidewalks, improving transit and overcoming a lack of political will on planning issues. Teeple noted that the bottom line is that there is still time to make the right choices in Northeast Florida and we as citizens should take advantage of that opportunity. Teeple further noted that there will be additional opportunities for First Coast residents to participate through Generation Check on January 30, 2010, and through Region First 2060 and the Regional Community Institute. ## Getting Your Money's Worth

Each year, District IV of the Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC) is responsible for implementing the Hazardous Materials Emergency Planning (HMEP) grant funds for Training courses and initiatives. The HMEP funds are provided through the U.S. Department of Transportation to help provide training assistance to firefighters, law enforcement officers, emergency medical technicians, and other first responders in the prevention, preparedness, mitigation, and response to hazardous materials incidents that may occur in their jurisdictions. This previous year saw a sharp increase in trained personnel and training hours provided by the LEPC District IV. A total of 279 people received hazardous material related training to increase their awareness, operational experience, or technical expertise. A variety of courses were offered or sponsored by the LEPC with 3,288 training hours were accrued between October, 2008 and September, 2009; that's over 137 days straight, or nearly four and a half months.

Due to the current economy, departments and agencies across the country are feeling the effects and operational budgets do not have the ability to afford the cost of instruction or traveling to a training event. Training is critical for personnel in the first responder field, and without it, operational and safety concerns can suffer. The HMEP funds are specifically designed to continue the education of the response profession and help to supplement their departments training budgets. The LEPC is already looking at the training it plans to provide during the upcoming year for your local area responders.

In order to become a graduate of the Class of 2010 of the Northeast Florida Regional Leadership Academy, you must: fill out and submit an application by December 15, 2009; attend the mandatory "Tools for Regional Leadership" Program; and attain eighteen (18) credits that may be completed over a two-year period.
