### **Regional Leadership Academy Class Meets in Palatka**

The Regional Leadership Academy's (RLA) Class of 2013 held their third program day on March 13th in Palatka. The day started with an overview of Ride Solution's innovative public transit system, including a presentation from Ride Solution's CEO, Boyd Thompson, on the design and construction of the Brevi Bus. The class was then transported from Ride Solution's office at the Train Museum to the Riverfront Park area of Palatka. Palatka city employees Thad Crowe (RLA Class of '13 member) and Jonathan Griffith then provided the class with a site visit of the Palatka Riverfront Park and explained the plans that the City has for continuing the redevelopment of this area of the City. The class then was provided a tour of the Ravine Gardens State Park. The field trip ended with a trip to the Palatka WaterWorks, the original water works for the City, where efforts to provide for natural food gardens and other education and conservation efforts were discussed.

The afternoon session kicked off with a presentation by Brad Thoburn, Vice President of Long Range Planning, Capital Programs and System Development, JTA (and RLA Class of '13 member) addressing regional issues in transportation and the multiple modal options that are being studied by JTA. Natural resource issues were addressed by Sarah Owen Gledhill, Planning Advocate, Florida Wildlife Federation, (and RLA Class of '10 graduate) and Lisa Rinaman, the St. Johns Riverkeeper. Ms. Gledhill discussed the issues facing Northeast Florida as growth continues and ways in which growth can be planned while maintaining the natural resources in the region. Ms. Rinaman provided insight on the role of the Riverkeeper in protecting the most important natural resource in Northeast Florida, the St. Johns River. #### **Clay Back to Basics**

The Northeast Florida Regional Council, in conjunction with Clay County Emergency Management, conducted a Disaster Preparedness Exercise on March 13th at the Clay County Emergency Operations Center (EOC). The intent of this exercise was to provide information on various disaster related topics, and to identify gaps in training or resources that should be addressed to allow the county to function more efficiently in a real disaster event.

Nearly 70 people attended the full day event which covered subjects such as the Role of Key Leadership in a Disaster, Available Technology in a Disaster, FEMA Reimbursement, EOC Activation/Operation during a Disaster, and Incident Action Plans and Situation Reports. Several prominent speakers also addressed the group throughout the day. Mike DeLorenzo, Deputy Director of Florida DEM provided the morning Keynote Address, followed by Mike Buresh of Action News as the closing Keynote Speaker. #### **St Johns Easter Outbreak**

St. Johns County Emergency Management in partnership with the Florida Department of Health – St. Johns County, held an exercise at the EOC on Thursday, March 21st. This exercise, entitled "Easter Outbreak 2013," focused on a disease outbreak, which required the County to have a mass vaccination of the citizens. This was a tabletop exercise which consisted of two modules of discussion and one breakout module in which participants were tasked with crafting their plans and procedures





for the next operational period. The exercise included over 50 representatives from the applicable Emergency Support Functions (ESF) including Law Enforcement, Fire/Rescue, Public Information, School District, Health, Red Cross, Medical Examiner's Office, Flagler Hospital and other agencies that would play a role in an outbreak. Emergency Preparedness Staff at the Council designed and facilitated this exercise as part of the County's State Homeland Security Grant Program (SHSGP) contract, which the Council has managed for the last several years.
